
The Florida CIOT Challenge recognizes the best overall traffic safety initiatives promoting safer driving in the agency's community.






## 2015 Florida DUI Challenge

## 2015 Florida Traffic Deaths

While the official numbers are still being tabulated and analyzed, it is no secret that 2015 saw more traffic related deaths than in previous years. Over 400 more people were killed on Florida's roadway in 2015 compared to 2014. Fifty-one of the sixty-seven counties had an increase in 2015 while fifteen had a decrease. Those fortunate sixteen counties are: Flagler, Hamilton, Hardee, Leon, Liberty, Nassau, Okeechobee, Osceola, Pasco, Pinellas, St. Johns, St. Lucie, Sumter, Suwannee, Taylor, and Walton.
