STREET TAKEOVERS, RACING, AND STUNT DRIVING: WHAT'S THE LAW?

A Person May Not:

 Participate in a street takeover, stunt driving, racing, competition or exhibition on a highway, roadway or parking lot in any way, including:



- Driving any motor vehicle, including a motorcycle, at one of these events
- Coordination or facilitation of these events
- Collection or exchange of money in support of these events
- Knowingly ride as a passenger in any such event or purposefully cause the movement of traffic, including pedestrian traffic, to slow, or stop, or be impeded in any way for these events.
- A person may not be a spectator at any race, drag race, or street takeover referenced above.





STREET TAKEOVERS, RACING, AND STUNT DRIVING are ILLEGAL IN FLORIDA!

The Risks Include:

Breaking the law and possible jail time.

 Endangering yourself, spectators, and other people. Just a spectator or passenger? You're breaking the law too!

Penalties for Offenders

- Mandatory one-year license suspension.
- 30-day impound of the vehicle.
- Fine for a first-time offense between \$500 and \$1,000.

Subsequent offenses include:

- Fine between \$1,000 and \$3,000 for a second offense.
- Mandatory two-year license suspension for a second offense.
- Fine between \$2,000 and \$5,000 for a third offense.
- Mandatory three-year license suspension for a third offense.

For repeat offenders, besides the mandatory 30-day vehicle impound, one could risk losing their vehicle and having it seized by the state.
